The meeting hall, which is also used for weddings, shines just as fresh and inviting as the building's festival fall. With the new glass lift, the building can be experienced barrier-free.

FAST ACTION INSTEAD OF LONG DISCUSSIONS: COVID-19 MEASURES IN MAMER 2 3

Protection instead of shock was the order of the day during Corona times. Thanks to the quick response, a stable catalogue of measures was created for all citizens. This included basic supplies, medicines, masks and rapid test stations - unbureaucratic and free of charge.

MAISON CITOYENNE: PUBLIC SPIRIT IN ACTION 4

Equality, integration, inclusion are important to us. That is why we have created a community centre. The "Maison Citoyenne". This is where people meet: fairtrade breakfast, inclusion festival or the public writers' project. Residents are helped here to write documents. Free of charge.



TOGETHER, SAFE AND STRONG: WE STAND FOR A CITIZEN-ORIENTED, PERSONAL AND SUSTAINABLE POLICY. PEOPLE AND ALL THEIR CONCERNS ARE AT THE CENTRE OF OUR EFFORTS. WITH A SUSTAINABLE FINANCIAL POLICY.

THAT IS WHY WE WILL:

SERVE OUR RESIDENTS QUICKLY: 1 2

With a modern citizens' centre on the ground floor of the SNHBM building, administrative procedures are made easier. And because more and more aspects of our everyday lives are mobile, we are planning to transform many services into digital ones. Via the web and app access. Any time, any place.





PROMOTING TOGETHERNESS THROUGH PROXIMITY AND DIALOGUE:

Strengthening of the staff of the "Maison Citoyenne" is a matter close to our hearts. A meeting café in the new civic centre and a help and advice service support this idea of togetherness in an effective and approachable way.



ADAPT THE MUNICIPALITY'S OWN INFRASTRUCTURES TO THE NEW CHALLENGES:

We envisage the construction of a new building for the communal technical service on the site of the SICA composting plant.

INVOLVE RESIDENTS MORE:

They can have a say in citizen forums and citizen surveys. Our goal: more citizen participation for more democracy.

ENSURE EXCHANGE WITH THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN:

Through videoconferencing chat with the Board of Aldermen in the evening hours.

ENSURE FINANCIAL STABILITY:

We plan an annual surplus in ordinary income of 15 million euros. At the same time, we want to limit the debt burden to 15% of ordinary revenues.

ENSURING THE SAFETY OF RESIDENTS:

That is why we plan to deploy security personnel around Brill Park and the Sports and Leisure Park in Capellen during the summer months. And because tangible safety is important to us, we will push for more traffic controls.

SAFETY HAS PRIORITY:

We want to install security cameras in public places (Mamer Schlass, Kinneksbond school and cultural complex).

WATCH OUT, SPEED CAMERAS:

We will put additional radar meters in some streets.

PROMOTE GOOD TOGETHERNESS:

We will increase the number of "Agents Municipaux" from three to five people. Their competences will be expanded to punish, for example, violations of the noise ordinance, damage in public spaces or the use of playgrounds outside the authorised times.

CAPELLEN SPORTS AND LEISURE PARK : ADVENTURES FOR YOUNG AND OLD 1 - 4

Lots of green, lots to experience. Capellen is revitalised with the large leisure and sports park. The wide range of activities on offer brings variety across all age groups. An adventure playground for children, a kiosk for refreshments and a freely accessible bouldering block have been created.



















RECHARGE YOUR BATTERIES, CLEAR YOUR HEAD: THE BRILL BOULDERING WALL 5

In the Brill Park, we are expanding the climbing offer for children. A second, smaller wall has been added to the 4-metre high climbing wall.

MAMER FOR ALL: NEW, SOCIAL HOUSING CONSTRUCTION 6 7

Good life for all. We are building 19 social housing units in the village centre. 131 parking spaces will be added in an underground car park. Another example is social housing in the "Weltgebond" neighbourhood. In cooperation with the public housing fund, 45 single-family houses and 179 flats in apartment buildings are being built here.

MORE MAMER, MORE LIFE: OUR MOST IMPORTANT MEASURES 8 9

Take a breath and enjoy everyday life. In Holzem, the Place de la Résistance has been redesigned. With an attractive meeting place in the middle of the village. With a playground, a bowling green and new parking spaces for cars and bicycles. And those looking for peace and relaxation will find it in Capellen in the future: Resting benches, an MBox for up to 16 bicycles, as well as parking space for e-vehicles paint a picture of tomorrow's coexistence already today.

IT'S NOT A QUESTION OF AGE: LIVING IN MAMER 10

Living for all generations. For our senior citizens we are realising 20 new units with the service of assisted living. Twelve single rooms and eight double rooms. And for sufficient contact with loved ones, a car park with 50 parking spaces is available.

WE ACT: FOR ALL CITIZENS, FOR OUR HOMELAND, FOR A LIVEABLE MAMER. DIRECTLY, HUMANELY AND WITH EACH OTHER.

THAT IS WHY WE WILL:

FOR THE YOUNGER GENERATION

MAKING MAMER'S HOLIDAY SEASON EVEN MORE ENJOYABLE:

With attractive free and holiday times for our children (e.g. children's play city).

MAKING IT EASIER FOR PUPILS AND STUDENTS TO ENTER WORKING LIFE:

Together with Youth & Work we want to offer trial placements and internships.

ENABLING STUDENTS@WORK:

With numerous holiday jobs within our community - and supervision of students during their assignments.

GIVING YOUNG PEOPLE "THE GIFT OF THE WORLD":

With a 90% subsidised Interrail pass for every adolescent who reaches the age of 18.

INSPIRING THE START-UP MENTALITY:

With support for students to set up micro-enterprises as part of their studies.

LIGHTING UP THE NIGHTLIFE:

With the late-night bus, offer new destinations along the "hotspots" (e.g. Merl, Hollerich, Rives de Clausen), and selectively use buses to larger events.

PROMOTING DEMOCRACY AT AN EARLY AGE:

With opportunities for young people to have a say in specific projects within the community.

PUTTING MAMER ON A ROLL:

With a full renovation of the skater facility in Park Brill.

U30 NEEDS SUPPORT:

With community housing for students and adults under 30.

FAMILIES, SOCIAL AND HOUSING

ENCOURAGING PLAY AND RELAXATION:

With an adventure playground behind the fairground in Holzem and more resting benches along our beautiful hiking trails.

SUPPORTING THE SMALLEST IN OUR FAMILIES:

Another community day-care centre for small children in the former presbytery house in Holzem.

PROVIDE MORE SUPPORT FOR THE SOCIALLY DISADVANTAGED:

We are planning 10 additional social housing units per year. We take responsibility for taking in asylum seekers within the framework of a national quota system. We will not agree to an amendment of the general development plan for the purpose of erecting a container structure.

BETTER SUPPORT FOR WOMEN:

We offer shelter to women in need at the site of the former presbytery house in Mamer.

THINKING OF THE ELDERLY:

We are creating a community action plan for seniors, with seniors. We involve all residents aged 65 and over. In addition, a special senior citizens' month with film screenings, training courses and excursions provides vitality and variety. Information material is prepared especially for our seniors.

REVITALISE THE SENIOR+ PROJECT:

We want to improve the quality of life of older people with Hëllef Doheem, for example by providing professional help with care insurance, advice on technical aids and on filling out important forms.

PROMOTING INTEGRATION:

An integrative encounter café or sociable walks through our forests will help with this - in Luxembourgish, of course.

PROMOTING INNOVATIVE FORMS OF HOUSING:

We give alternative ideas a chance. Whether modular construction, cohousing, multi-generation households or the realisation of Tiny Houses.

A DOCTOR FOR ALL:

We will work for the establishment of additional general practitioners in our municipality.

HEAD FIRST INTO PLEASURE: THE MAMER SWIMMING HALL 1 2

More and more children in Luxembourg can't swim! With the new swimming hall on the Kinneksbond campus, we are stopping this trend. This way, every primary school pupil up to intermediate level should get to know the element of water with ease. A large swimming pool and a teaching pool with a floor that can be adjusted in height provide the basis for this campaign. In addition, the local table tennis club finds its new home in an extra room.



EDUCATION AND MOVEMENT: THE MAISON RELAIS MAMER 3 - 6

With the new Maison Relais, space are being created for around 220 children.

TO SHAPE THE FUTURE OF OUR CHILDREN WE WILL:

CREATE MODERN LEARNING SPACE: 1 2

With new classrooms and a Maison Relais on the Capellen campus. Our promise: Every school-aged child in our community will have a place in one of the care structures.

PRACTICE EARLY:

Early education will be guaranteed to every child from the age of 3.

ENCOURAGING CREATIVITY:

By replacing the "École Mameranus" with a contemporary centre for life long learning.

REWARDING SCHOOL PERFORMANCE BETTER:

With increased support through a new tiered support bonus.

COMMUNICATING WITH NATURE:

Under the motto "Let's get out into the forest", we want to establish a sustainable place of education in the forest for the community's school institutions.

LEARNING ENGLISH THROUGH PLAY:

We want to offer basic English and Chinese as an option at school outside school hours.

PROMOTE MEDIA LITERACY AND DIGITAL LITERACY:

We want to make more use of the iPads we have introduced in the Mamer schools. The pupils should learn how to use modern media sensibly. We want to educate them about the dangers on the net.

MAKING READING MORE FUN:

The reading competence of the pupils should be increased with the help of reading mentors. For example, the reading mentor meets with the pupil once a week in the library. He asks questions and improves the pupil's pronunciation.

SCHOOL FOR THE PARENTS:

With an optimal integration into the school community - for example via contemporary information channels, such as newsletters, Youtube or messenger services. There will be courses, seminars and conferences to advise parents on educational issues amongst others.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION TODAY, FOR SWIMMING AND BATHING ENJOYMENT TOMORROW:

With completed swimming training for every school-age child from cycle 3.1 at the latest.

FACILITATE FURTHER CYCLE WORKSHOPS IN THE SCHOOL:

After the successful start of this measure, even more children should be able to cycle safely on their way to school in and in everyday life.

MAKING CREATIVITY EVEN MORE FUN:

With further language and sports courses (e.g. selfdefence in sports lessons, 1st aid courses as school lessons), as well as our creative workshops.

TOP MARKS FOR OUR MUSIC SCHOOL: A MAMER SUCCESS STORY 1 2

With over 700 enrolments every year, our music school is a great success. The new edition will fit seamlessly into the cultural centre. An auditorium for about 130 people will be built in the modern building. In addition, there will be rooms for music teaching.



FESTIVE ATMOSPHERE IN HOLZEM: THE NEW FESTIVAL HALL 3 4

A larger foyer, a practical multi-purpose hall and a gleaming new kitchen: the Holzem festival hall has been modernised from top to bottom. The stage technology was renewed.





MORE SUPPORT FOR THE COMMON GOOD: THE VERÄINSHAUS HOLZEM 5

The new "Veräinshaus" Holzem will make club life much easier for the many volunteers. The new infrastructure includes a meeting room for about 50 people, 19 storage rooms and a modern kitchen.



A HEART FOR YOUTH: THE MAMER SCOUTSHOME

The children and youth of our community are close to our hearts. The scout chalet of the Mamer Wiselen was enlarged and completely renovated. In the interest of energy security, a powerful photovoltaic system was also installed on this building.



LIVING MAMER: THE WËLLEBAU 7

The "Wëllebau" is a gem from 1918. More than a hundred years later, it is time for new life in the old walls. With a light-flooded restaurant, a place of encounter, pleasure and good taste is being created. A modern banquet hall with a stage brings a festive atmosphere to Mamer.



LIVING AND EXPERIENCING IN MAMER: OUR COMMUNITY SHOULD REMAIN CULTURALLY AND SPORTINGLY ATTRACTIVE. WE STAND FOR A MAMER THAT MAKES COMMITTED VOLUNTEERING AND VITAL CLUB LIFE WORTHWHILE. SOCIAL INTEGRATION IS PROMOTED BY ACTIVE CLUBS AND A VARIED CULTURAL LIFE. TOGETHER WITH A DIVERSE RANGE OF LEISURE ACTIVITIES, MAMER STANDS ON ATTRACTIVE PILLARS THAT MAKE OUR LIFE IN THE MUNICIPALITY WORTH LIVING.

THAT IS WHY WE WILL ON A CULTURAL LEVEL:

CONSISTENTLY FOCUS ON SEASONAL OFFERS:

With after-work concerts in the warm season, where we want to focus more on artists from our foreign communities. Or with an invitation to the ice rink and the rustic sports bar as part of the winter programme. For us, diversity in society means diversity in the cultural programme.

DARE TO TRY SOMETHING NEW:

With summer aperitif concerts on the newly designed Place de la Résistance in Holzem - or a weekend programme for residents of Capellen in the Sports and Leisure Park.

STAGING CULTURE IN A FRESH WAY: 1

With the construction of a new cultural centre in Capellen - a sparklingly beautiful glass building enclosing the "Risch building".



SETTING A NEW TONE:

With a wide-open music school and regular performances by the UGDA Music School in the new auditorium. But also with exciting conference, theatre, cabaret and chamber music evenings.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION FOR ATTRACTIVE EXHIBITIONS:

With the fundamental renovation of the "Op der Cap" gallery.

PUTTING ART "IN FRONT OF THE DOOR":

With the project "Art in Public Space" in our leisure areas in Mamer and Capellen, art is to be made accessible to a broad public. Artists should also be able to use buildings that are being demolished for a limited period.

We will continue to support our associations. Therefore we will:

BUILD A NEW SPORTS HALL:

For example, next to the Nicolas Frantz sports hall or on the Route d'Arlon. But it is also possible to build the new sports hall instead of the René Federspiel building (former nouvelle école). The car park under the SNHBM building in Mamer gives us the opportunity to create synergies.

OPEN THE SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURES OF THE BIG MAMER SCHOOLS IN THE EVENING FOR OUR CLUBS:

Meaning the planned Sportlycée, the Lycée Josy Barthel and the European School on the Campus scolaire Tossebierg.

PROVIDE MORE INFORMATION ABOUT ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS:

Twice a year with a "Veräinsbuet" and with the help of electronic advertisements everywhere in the municipality.

OFFER SPECIAL SPORTS COURSES FOR CHILDREN:

This under the motto "Mamer moves".

OPEN THE NEW SWIMMING HALL AT THE MAMER SCHOOL:

This with pilot projects for Mamer clubs and aquagym courses for residents.

MAKING OUR CLUBS MOBILE:

With a minibus for 9 people which the associations can rent.

MAKING THE STADE FRANÇOIS TRAUSCH MORE PLAYABLE:

With a state-of-the-art artificial turf and new grandstand.

EXPAND THE TENNIS HALL IN CAPELLEN:

A pavilion for catering and drinks will be added at the Sports and Leisure Park.

OFFERING LIVE SPORT:

In the Nicolas Franz sports hall, create the possibility to broadcast the sporting events in the hall via livestream in the entrance area, with a new ambience.

PROMOTING FITNESS FOR ALL:

We will do this by setting up a natural fitness trail in the forest with wooden equipment.



A MUNICIPALITY ... CARING ABOUT NATURE PROTECTION ... WITH SUSTAINABLE WAYS OF TRANSPORTATION

BECAUSE THERE IS ONLY ONE EARTH: CLIMATE AND NATURE PROTECTION IN MAMER

Climate protection, energy-efficient refurbishment and electricity generation from natural resources are our top priorities in Mamer. With the Climate Pact 2.0 and the Nature Pact, the municipality has committed itself to climate protection, energy efficiency, sustainable development and the preservation of biodiversity. Protecting our planet is not just lip service. This is where we get serious!

TAKING CLIMATE PROTECTION SERIOUSLYMEANS:1

In the spirit of efficient waste avoidance, we regularly organise Repair Café's in our community.

At the Capellen school campus, 100% of the heat is generated from renewable energy.

The new swimming pool is heated with pellet heating. A modern heat pump operates in the new house of associations.

More than 30% of the 2.000 street lamps have been converted to LED technology.





The call bus is 100% electric.

The new cogeneration plant generates heat from biomass. This saves more than 2.5 million tonnes of CO_2 per year.

The solar panels on the municipal buildings will cover around 40% of the municipality's own electricity consumption in 2024. They have an impressive output of 1,500,000 kWh. This will save us 280 tonnes of CO_2 per year.

The municipality of Mamer has installed electricity columns for cars in the public parking area.





RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR RESOURCES, RESPECT FOR MOTHER EARTH. AS A MUNICIPALITY, WE STAND FOR THE CAREFUL TREATMENT OF OUR ENVIRONMENT IN ORDER TO OFFER GENERATIONS OF TOMORROW AN EQUALLY BEAUTIFUL HOME. THE CONSISTENT REDUCTION OF THE CO₂ FOOTPRINT AND THE PROTECTION OF BIODIVERSITY ARE THE GUARANTEE FOR A LIVEABLE MAMER. WE ACT INSTEAD OF JUST TALKING!

ACTING FOR NATURE MEANS:

CONSISTENT EXPANSION OF ELECTRIC MOBILITY:

We support the traffic turnaround with 10 new e-charging stations per year in our residential districts. In addition, publicly accessible e-charging stations will become mandatory in new housing areas.

MORE GREEN SPACES FOR A BETTER LIVING CLIMATE:

In public spaces, more green spaces ensure pleasant living and innovative ventilation in times of climate change. This is happening, for example, on the square in front of the church in Capellen. And because green is better than grey, we are removing the asphalt at the car park "a Schungeschten". Planting new trees on our playgrounds provides more shade. So that people and nature can breathe easy again!

USING SOLAR ENERGY INTELLIGENTLY:

Covering public car parks with modern solar technology helps us to do this. We are realising this, for example, on the parking area "a Schungeschten", as well as by partially roofing the car park on the Kinneksbond campus.

ENERGY RENOVATION:

We are bringing the Jean Marx building and the building of the former Henri Trauffler School up to the current state of renovation technology in terms of air conditioning.

TEACHING KNOWLEDGE ABOUT NATURE AND CLIMATE PROTECTION:

We are creating an attractive biodiversity nature trail on boardwalks through the Sicona meadows near Engelsratt forest. In untouched nature, children and adults can discover plant diversity here on site and via app. To better protect our biodiversity.

MAKING NATURE CONSERVATION PART OF EVERYDAY LIFE:

With an expanded range of courses, for example on fruit and hedge pruning or the optimal design of gardens.

BUY LOCAL AND ENJOY:

With a revived market in the village centre. Because this is where it belongs!

SHINE A LIGHT:

We will convert another 2.000 street lamps to energyefficient LED technology.



A MUNICIPALITY ... CARING ABOUT NATURE PROTECTION ... WITH SUSTAINABLE WAYS OF TRANSPORTATION

MAMER IS GROWING: MOBILITY SERVICES GROW WITH IT 1 - 4

THE JOURNEY IS THE DESTINATION: And along the way, our citizens have access to a wide range of mobility services. The offer grows parallel to the growth of our community, for example through the introduction of a car sharing system.

BY BIKE AND BY ACTION: the municipality of Mamer has joined the "Vel'OH!" bike rental network. Initially, 6 stations are available. All bicycles are electronically assisted with an autonomy of up to 40 kilometres.

CYCLING UNDER POWER: A charging station for electric bicycles has been set up in Park Brill. It is powered exclusively by solar energy.

A FREE RIDE FOR BICYCLES: The network of cycle paths has been permanently expanded. Mamer and Holzem have been connected by a 3-metre-wide path. In Holzem, a direct connection to cycle path 13 is being created in the direction of Capellen.



GETTING SERIOUS ABOUT MODERN MOBILITY MEANS:

FURTHER LINKING CYCLE PATHS: 1 2

With a bicycle and foot connection along the Faulbaach in Mamer. A bicycle connection between the village centre and the route d'Arlon is being created via rue Pierre Krier Becker. Holzem will get a direct connection to the railway station in Capellen.

LETTING BICYCLES INTO OUR DAILY LIVES:

With an increased number of "Vel'OH!" stations (14 in the short term). For example in Capellen at the railway station and the Sports and Leisure Park, in Mamer at the "Cité Mambra", at the European School and the Lycée Josy Barthel, and in Holzem at the festival hall.

MAKING THE MOBILITY TRANSITION A TANGIBLE EXPERIENCE:

With a shared space zone in Capellen in the Route d'Arlon (at the level of the school and Maison Relais). In addition, with another shared space zone in the centre of Mamer in the rue du Marché

THINKING MOBILITY DIFFERENTLY:

With innovative actions, such as a car-free experience day with a festive programme in one of our localities.

PARKING PROPERLY:

With a parking management concept of public parking spaces in our municipality.

ON TIME:

With real-time displays at the main bus stops.

REMOVING OBSTACLES:

With a subway at the level crossing in Capellen.

CREATING PRACTICAL SPACE:

With a request to the relevant authorities to build a contemporary multi-storey car park next to the Mamer railway station.

CREATING SAFE SPACE:

With a progressive expansion of the residential parking.

PUSH ACCESS AND CONNECTION:

With the connection of our community to the urban bus network - and the demand for the extension of the tram to Mamer.

ENABLE PUBLICITY:

With an open day with local businesses and a regular market for Mamer products.

ACTIVATE YOUNG PEOPLE:

Introduce the different crafts to the pupils of the Mamer schools on a regular basis.

IMPROVE INFRASTRUCTURE:

Repair the network of field paths with 200,000 euros annually, modernise and better illuminate the field path between Mamer and Capellen.

SUPPORT START-UPS:

Give new businesses a helping hand in their search for coworking space.

REDUCE COSTS:
